With your spiritual light,
dispel the darkness of ignorance;
dissolve the clouds of discord and war
and spread goodwill, peace, and harmony among the people.

Never seek any help, charity, or favours
from anybody except God.
Never go the court of kings,
but never refuse to bless and help the needy and the poor,
the widow, and the orphan, if they come to your door.

This is your mission, to serve the people.....

Carry it out dutifully and courageously, so that I, as your Peer-o-Murshad,
may not be ashamed of any shortcomings on your part
before the Almighty Allah and our holy predecessors
in the Silsila (chain) on the Day of Judgement.
